Pastors Timothy and Rebecca have been reunited this year and are living on the ATM base in Doisaket, Chiangmai.



Impact of COVID19 in Thailand

Overall the situation of Covid 19 in Thailand has been relatively contained. With a total to date of 5,289 cases nationwide and 60 deaths. The main impact has been on the tourist industry which is the country's main income source. Small local businesses have managed to continue but the main income source which has always been tourism even local tourism has been hindered and effected many jobs and businesses.

It has been surreal to see some of the main areas in our city which are usually bustling now so quiet and empty.

The people are generally compliant and cooperate well with the authorities working together to contain any outbreaks in the community which has resulted in shorter quarantine periods allowing people to get back on their feet quicker.

The main concern now is the outbreak in Myanmar and surrounding countries now coming across into Thailand. Thailand borders 3 main countries that have had more severe outbreaks and the risk of borders being breached is high.

The main challenge we face as ministers is to help people through their feelings of fear and anxiety. But we are seeing a greater openness to the Gospel for comfort peace and answers to this pandemic.

ATM Base Prep

Haven of Grace has fully moved off ATM base. Dakhota and Karenna have been able to secure a new location to shelter and run the Haven of Grace project.

The last few months the team have been cleaning, repairing and repainting the big building and main hall ready to receive our new intake of students for the Discipleship Training School due to reopen next year in 2021.

The base is looking well maintained and Ps Timothy will be sharing some plans of revamping some of the facilities to better accommodate the Discipleship school students and training program.

Ps Rebecca is preparing the new office and setting ups the curriculum ready for the new student intake.

Early in December, we were invited to a village near Mae La Noi, the home village of one of our ATMDTS graduates who is now a respected leader in his village. Ps Weerachai invited Ps Timothy to speak at their Christmas Event, where over 500 people had gathered. Many of the young people there had come with Ps Weerachai to Fire Camp at ATM earlier. They all expressed how they enjoyed Ps Timothy's message at the camp and wanted him to speak again. While we were there, many of our former students and graduates came up to greet us. We were able to see firsthand the fruit of the many years we had invested in the ATMDTS in the past. Ps Weerachai's elderly uncle shared with us how he travels around many of the nearby villages. In each village, he asked the pastor or leader there, where they had studied. They all responded ATMDTS. We have received numerous requests to relaunch the ATMDTS (Asian Tribal Ministries Discipleship Training School). These former graduates all want to send their young people to train with us.

Another blessing was several people coming up and saying they remember our work along the Thai/Burma border. Tharamu Rosebell, in particular, reminisced about how when there was the influx of refugees from the Karen land into Thailand many years ago, Ps Timothy and Rebecca and our family were there distributing much needed milk powder to the orphaned children and babies under her care.

On the 26-27 December, we will also be going to another ATMDTS graduate's Children's home. Ps Timothy will also be speaking there. Again, the young people who came to Fire Camp, were blessed by Ps Timothy's message and want to hear him speak again. God's message of Good News, is being heard. It is so refreshing to hear of the fruit of our labour for the Lord.

We want to thank everyone who has partnered with us in reaching out to these remote areas. Looking back over the years. We remember you all with great fondness, working side by side and giving generously so we were enabled to achieve much together in advancing God's Kingdom.

2021 is now clearly on the horizon, and we are excited about what God has in store.



Fire Camp 2020

This year despite the effects of Covid we saw 350 youth show up at our annual youth Fire Camp.
